As Senior classes would have it, the 2007 graduates have to rank up there with the most influential, productive, successful and endearing ever. Quiet and shy did not mean unproductive in training by any means. Em worked for everything she ever accomplished and did so without a single complaint, in fact vou couldn't work her hard enough. She loved to be challenged. I normally don't like to dwell on injuries, even though they often create defining moments in any athlete's career. Well Emily's, 13 fracture, shattered, jig saw puzzle of an ankle recovery, defines her personality to a T. Most would have hung up their grips but that is just not Emily's style. Oh how I admire that. A national championship and a full ride scholarship later, she certainly has been rewarded for her perseverance but the coolest thing is, Emily would have done it anyway ... without any gold at the end of the rainbow. That is her style.

Taylor Zondervan transferred to Twistars as a level 6 at 8 years old. Talent was apparent from the time she turned her first cartwheel and it grew until landing her full ride scholarship to University of Oklahoma. As driven of an athlete that there has ever been, Taylor always took the position that she could always do better, train harder, accomplish more and that is what she did. Tay has also put to rest any doubt that sprouting past 66 inches means eminent doom for a gymnast ... she has continued to excel in spite of what some would call being vertically challenged. As beautiful on the inside as she is on the out, Tay has created a remarkable resume. She has captured state and regional championship titles, she is a 2 time Region 5 All Star team member earning her international assignments, and a 2006 USA J.O. National Team Member.

Mallory Brewer joined us a late in her career as a talented athlete looking for direction in her Freshman year of high school. Kari Pearce has to be the sweetest most unassuming athlete ever to grace the presence of gymnastics. It is so refreshing to coach a gifted child (or any for that matter) that has the ability to remain humble, gracious and genuinely

thankful during an entire career. No matter how great she became as a gymnast (and few have become better) Kari remained grounded. Combine that huggable disposition with extreme talent and you have a coach's dream. Of our four graduates "Pearce" has been at Twistars the shortest amount of time. This nonetheless, does not indicate less of an impact on our program. Kari has etched her place as one of the all time greats, earning 2 consecutive J.O. National Team member births, 3 Region 5 All Star team assignments, and 2 national Vaulting titles (the only J.O. athlete in the USA to compete a double twist TWICE at nationals). These achievements helped secure a life time dream and goal of

being awarded a full ride scholarship to the University of Michigan. Few are more deserving of success.

Saying farewell to outstanding athletes as they enter a new phase of life always leaves an empty hole in the heart. Saying goodbye to such wonderful young ladies makes the hole an abyss. Twistars will miss this fantastic foursome for sure but the Gedderts' may need a few extra hugs this summer as they prepare for life without them. NATIONAL RESULTS

Lots to report from the National Championships and American Classic competitions.

Level 9 Eastern Nationals were held in Kissimmee Florida where 7 Twistars helped Region 5 capture the overall team title. Arielle Dyer was crowned E/N Vault champion and placed 2nd in the AA and Floor, 3rd UB and 8th B. Maya Ketner finished 5th AA and UB, 9th V and 8th Fl. Kristen Seidowski also placed

5th AA and added a 2nd UB. Maci Sump placed 10th on V and Beam. Also competing were Dena Mackenzie, Cici Talcott and Brittany Holmes.

Level 10 Nationals were held in Cincinnati, Ohio where another 7 Twistar athletes helped region 5 dominate the USA by winning the overall regional team title. Elizabeth Mahlich and Kari Pearce both earned USA National Team spots by placing 2nd AA. BB placed 2nd on UB and B while Kari earned Her second national vault title. Also winning vault titles were Nicole Dayton (her 3rd straight) and Kamerin Moore, who both placed 7th in the AA. Mallory Brewer placed 2nd on Floor and Taylor Medrea and Shonda Clore had great meets.

At the recent American Classic held in Houston, Texas Jordyn Wieber place 1st AA, V, UB and FX and qualified to the Championships of the USA. Her AA score of 57.7 was good enough to rank her 9th in the country (including all Seniors). Remarkable!

Kami fared very well in her first attempt to qualify to championships. She placed 2nd on beam and 3rd on floor but ended up .7 short of the qualifying score (mostly due to overly harsh judging on bars).
