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TIM RAND

It is simply amazing the kind of impact any one individual can have on another person, directly or indirectly.

Our program has been remarkably influenced by Tim Rand, a gymnastics icon. I fully realize the impact that his program at American Twisters in Pompano Beach. Florida has had on ours as I spent many years trying to bottle his coaching magic. For vears THOSE TWISTERS were the team to emulate. I cant tell you how many times we walked out of various competitions wondering how any team could be that incredible and incredible is a true understatement. From top to bottom, from level 4 through elite, Tim's athletes painted a picture of perfection. They were flawless in their execution and relentless in their desire to compete. The country watched in amazement as his teams dominated with style and class.

The lessons learned from Tim Rand have without a doubt put our club on the national map and although NOBODY could ever duplicate his accomplishments, we are at least more enlightened and educated due to his influence. He was brilliant in his application of gymnastic knowledge within his own club but never once hesitated sharing that wealth with those in search of the "answers". The learning curve of coaching for many was significantly shortened due to Tim's willingness to share his ideas.

Sometimes we are affected by people we never meet. Few if any of the Twistars current team members even know Tim Rand's name as he has been on a different gymnastics path for the past few years. They would however recognize some of the athletes that he has graced over time... Jana Bieger (world champion), Morgan White (Olympian), Cassie Price (National



champion), and Michelle Campi (Olympian) to name a few. Out of all the coaches in the USA. Tim Rand has to have had as much impact on our athletes as any. Tim is responsible for setting our current standard of excellence and our blue collar work ethic philosophy. He has indirectly influenced the standard of gymnastics at Twistars and across this nation.

I had the pleasure of serving on the Junior Olympic Program Committee with Tim for years. His vision for gymnastics helped to shape our current system. I have had the



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pleasure of attending international competitions with Tim (Buenas Aires Argentina – USA vs Argentina and USA vs Belarus, China and Ukraine) where he was an ambassador of good will and respected role model. I have witnessed first hand his love of kids, love of

sport and love of family and always admired that passion.

Tim Rand recently past away unexpectedly at the age of 51. The gymnastics world aches from his absence. He has given so much to this sport and

gymnastics is without a doubt a better sport because of his presence. Say a thank you in your next prayer to a man that you probably never met YET has had a remarkable impact on your gymnastics lives. Say thanks to Tim Rand.

I couldn't have been prouder of their maturity and competitive spirit. While others succumbed to the pressure of the national spotlight, JoJo and Kam remained steadfast and fearless. It was a sight to see.

Jordyn Wieber is a power to reckon with and will be for quite some time. A 3rd place finish in the All Around including 2 silver (Vault and Beam) and a bronze (Bars) marked her banner performance. Probably overstated yet under appreciated was the fact that she did this as a 12 year old. (1st and 2nd place were 14). Amazing!

National Team coordinator,

Martha (Pronounced Marta but spelled Martha) has indicated that this year Jordyn will see her first international assignments. Initially assigned to a Belgium competition that was cancelled, Jordyn will now set her sights on the Junior Pan American Games. Jr. PAG will be held in Guatemala in late November and will feature competition between North, South, and Latin America as well as the Caribbean nations.

Another consideration will be the more prestigious and competitive Pacific Alliance Championships in April. This competition will feature countries that border on the Pacific Ocean (Australia, China, Canada, Japan etc) and will use a combination of Junior and Senior age athletes.

Martha also made a point to acknowledge the progress and potential of our newest elite, Kamerin Moore. Of particular interest was the ability she displayed going 8 for 8 in the toughest competition of the year. She was UNSHAKABLE and although the final results had her positioned .15 from the final national team spot, her performances were nonetheless, impressive.

.15 is an UGLY number! In an open ended scoring system it is comparable to .025 or LESS in the J.O. system of scoring. .15 will be branded in our minds for the next year. .15 will be the secret motivation for Kami as we proceed towards the next competitive season. She will point the toes harder, straighten the knees tighter, jump higher, split fuller, run faster, and there is no doubt about it. Sometimes it is a small disappointment that provides the fuel to propel us forward. Kami is now fueled.

Congratulations JoJo and Kami. You made us all very proud!

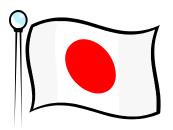

If for some reason any of the aforementioned competition dates conflict with major family/school or religious commitments please inform BLAIZE immediately. Please inform him in writing to be sure that this base is covered. Once entry fees are submitted by booster club they are generally NON-REFUNDABLE. With this being said we want to make sure that we do not pay for a competition IF you have a conflict and will not be able to attend. As a general rule (booster club rule) if an entry is paid, and non-refundable, withdrawing from that competition would mean reimbursing boosters club for the registration fee.

Most boys competitions are deemed "family" competitions in which hotel, and transportation is the responsibility of the individual families. Should a competition be deemed a "team" competition then the athletes would travel and stay together as a team under the direction of the coaching staff and a designated chaperon. Travel arrangements for any team designated meets would be made by the booster club travel committee.
